

# SENIORS SERVICES



The New Horizons for Seniors Program (NHSP) Pan-Canadian funding from Employment and Social Development Canada (ESDC) supports large projects that meet the growing social needs of seniors and create an important impact in communities. To pursue the program, the Centre for Newcomers (CFN) designed the Services to Empower and Build Resilience in Seniors Project, which will run for up to 5 years, from March 20, 2025, to March 16, 2030.

CFN, as the backbone organization, and collaborating with five ethnocultural organizations, who, under this project are named collaborating organizations (COs), implements a collective impact initiative (CII) to increase the social inclusion of various groups of vulnerable seniors (55+), such as women, 2SLGBTQIA+, individuals experiencing homelessness, Black and racialized people, persons with disabilities, and low-income seniors across Calgary, Alberta. The initiative will focus on promoting community participation and addressing barriers to accessing services for vulnerable groups of seniors, particularly those facing social, cultural, or economic challenges.

The project aims to increase social inclusion of vulnerable seniors, improve their independence within their families, social circles, and the larger community, and build on the assets and strengths of COs and their communities.
